

## Receiving / Disposing Stolen Property

(Not Motor Vehicles)

ss.188(1)(b) / 189A (NSW) Crimes Act

s 188(1)(b) Receive, or dispose of, or attempt to dispose of, any property the stealing whereof amounts to a serious indictable offence, knowing property to have been stolen

(b) any other property

Maximum Penalty: 10 years

NOTE: s 188 was amended 14.12.2001 to add subsection (a) separating stolen motor vehicle or motor vehicle parts from other property and increasing the maximum penalty for receiving such property to 12 years. Stolen 'vessel or vessel parts' was added to (a) on 1.9.2006. See separate table

S 189A(1) Receive or dispose of, or attempt to dispose of, or has in his or her possession, any property stolen outside the State of New South Wales, knowing property to have been stolen

Maximum Penalty: 10 years
